



Fagus sylvatica 'Riversii'

The cultivar 'Riversii' is a slow growing tree with a round semi-transparent crown and a height of 25 - 30 m and a spread of 10 - 15 m. The oval to ovate leaves are larger than of the species. They can become circa 12 cm. Most striking feature of the 'Riversii' is the glossy, deep black-brown leaf. The leaf retains its colour well into autumn and is much more colour-retentive than the 'Purpurea'. The tree is used in parks and avenues. It prefers a calcareous, moisture-retentive but well-drained soil, rich in humus content. The tree is intolerant to hard surfacing and high water tables. Winter hardiness zone: 5b
