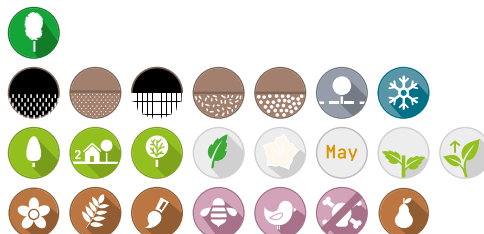




## Sorbus americana



Высота	10 - 12 m
Ширина	6-8m
Крона	ovoid to round, half-open crown
Кора и ветви	bark grey, twigs glossy reddish-brown
Лист	imparipinnate, approx. 25 cm, 13 - 17 leaf segments, green, feathered leaf
Осенний окрас	желтый, оранжевый
Цветы	in umbels, Ø approx. 16 cm, white, May/June
Плоды	orange-red, Ø 0.6 – 0.9 cm, very abundant
Колючки/шипы	None
Ядовитость	неядовитый, обычно
Вид почвы	peaty soil, does not stand up to heavy clay or wet soils

In its natural habitat in the northeast of North America this species grows to become a small to medium-sized tree. It is a slow grower with a light-grey trunk and glossy reddish-brown twigs. This gives the tree a remarkable appearance in the winter. The imparipinnate leaves consist of 13 - 17 lanceolate leaflets that turn golden yellow in the autumn. The leaf edge is usually sharply serrated. The flowers are in umbels with a diameter of approx. 16 cm. The separate flowers are 0.5 – 0.7 cm in size and white. Orange-red berries follow in the autumn. *S. americana* closely resembles *S. aucuparia* but is distinguished by the reddish-brown twigs and the somewhat narrower dark green leaves.
